## **Report 1: Overview**

### **■ Preamble**

With a mission to become an internationally-recognized liberal arts university characterized by excellence in teaching, competence in research and a commitment to scholarship, Lingnan has charted a course of developments, improvements and changes in many areas to achieve its goals. Against a background of funding cuts and reductions in student numbers, we have demonstrated substantial progress in research and scholarly activities since 1999 as evidenced by the results of an Internal Research Assessment Exercise (IRAE) conducted in 2003 by 6 external members using the same UGC threshold standards. The Research Index as a whole was 67.90%, which had already surpassed the target rate of 60% as set out in the University's Strategic Plan for 2003-2010. 42.86% of our full-time staff had an overall score of "1" (meaning fully "research active") as compared to only 25.64% in the 1999 UGC RAE. The IRAE results are very encouraging and most Departments have made significant improvements as far as productivity (number of active researchers) is concerned.

The academic staff profile has improved significantly in recent years (please see [Figure 1](#) on page 7). Our success rates in receiving Competitive Earmarked Research Grants (CERGs) are given in [Figure 2](#) on page 7. Data on number of CERG Projects received by staff in percentage terms in the disciplines of Humanities, Social Sciences & Business Studies and Research Performance Index are set out in [Figure 3](#) and [Figure 4](#) on page 8 respectively. All these clearly demonstrate our research capability and progress.

### **■ Institutional Policy on Research**

Striking an appropriate balance between teaching and research is central to the University's approach to the development of a research culture. While teaching is its primary mission, research is seen as a vital element of scholarly activity which supports and enriches teaching.

The University's research policy is designed to optimize the use of research funds through quality enhancement, focused development and collaborative endeavour. Quality enhancement is achieved through faculty appointment and continuing improvement of its existing staff profile. Focused development is achieved as a result of identification of areas of excellence and the recruitment of faculty to build up strengths in these areas. Collaborative endeavour is fostered by establishing research centres that provide both research support and coordination.

### **■ Staff Development Policy**

To ensure that faculty members will be given adequate opportunities to engage in research and development activities as well as a concentrated period for writing, the University has

expanded the study leave scheme by awarding a maximum time-off period from 6 months (on full pay) to 12 months (on 75% of current salary) since the academic year 2001-2002. This will allow academic staff, through re-arrangements of teaching schedule and utilization of summer vacation, to be released from teaching and administrative duties to concentrate on research/study/writing full time. Altogether, seven academic members from six departments, each for six months, were released in 2003-2004.

During the year under review, the University has been able to commit HK\$0.87 million to support staff-development activities. For members of the academic staff, these grants were primarily for attending overseas conferences. A total of 76 academic papers were presented, through which staff have been, and will continue to be, able to share the results of their research with local or overseas specialists, and to receive the feedback they require before making the research more generally available in a published form.

### ■ Priority Research Areas

Lingnan is fully aware of the need to focus its research efforts on its areas of strengths. At Lingnan, research and teaching are seen as interactive, one enriching the other field of endeavour. The synergy between teaching and research is particularly relevant to Lingnan, as our teaching exhibits a strong empirical orientation.

In the next triennium, a total of eight priority research areas have been identified for focused support. These are: Cultural Research and Development, Public Humanities, Modern Literature in Chinese, Aesthetics and Theories of the Arts, Taxation, Managerial and Organisational Issues in Chinese Mainland, Social Gerontology and Public Policy. All these research areas are in line with our liberal arts mission, and are selected based on the existing strengths and proven track record, as well as their connectivity to the undergraduate teaching. While details of these eight research areas can be found in the University's Academic Development Proposals for the 2005-2008 Triennium (set out in five perspectives, viz. their relations to our role, niche, present strength, relationship between research and teaching, and the areas for focused research), a brief account of each of these areas is given in [Appendix 1](#) on pages 9-11 for easy reference.

### ■ Inter-Institutional Collaboration

While at present inter-institutional collaboration exists mainly at the individual level, a system has been set up by Programme-based Research Institutes/Centres to channel resources into special areas of research and to develop important links with local, regional and overseas institutions for academic exchanges, conferences and other collaborative activities. Research clusters have been set up within each Institute/Centre to encourage participation by as many faculty members as possible. The International Joint-Research Programme has been running successfully, through which distinguished scholars from outside Hong Kong are invited to team up with research fellows at various institutes/centres to work on topics of mutual interest. Subsistence allowances had been provided for these partners to make a short trip to Hong Kong to enhance collaboration. Scholars currently

engaged in the joint programme include Professor Oded Stark from the University of Oslo, Professor Stan Siebert from the University of Birmingham, Professor David Round from the University of South Australia, Professor John Heywood from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Dr Patricia Siplon from Saint Michael's College, and Dr John Barkdull from Texas Tech University.

In 2003-2004, the University had set aside a sum of HK\$150,000 to finance two-way academic-exchange activities between institutions of higher learning on the Mainland and Lingnan. A total of six incoming and six outgoing visits were supported by this Academic Exchanges with China Scheme. Visiting institutions included Peking University, Nankai University, Northeastern University, Chinese Academy of Social Sciences, among others.

### ■ Organization of Research Funding

The Research and Postgraduate Studies Committee (RPSC) is charged with the formulation of policies for the promotion, conduct, supervision and funding of research in the University. It decides on all internal funding allocations and monitors progress of research projects on various grants. Research Panels at the Programme level undertake initial assessment of applications for research grants and make funding recommendations to the RPSC. The Office of Research and Staff Development (ORSD) provides administrative assistance to the Committee in the management of allocated grants to ensure that all funding and budgetary procedures are properly followed.

The University aims to support as many worthwhile research projects as possible where reasonable research thresholds are attained. Internal research grants are allocated on the basis of competitive bids. Each application is evaluated on the basis of its academic merit, feasibility within the indicated time frame, budgetary appropriateness, and the track record of the investigator(s).

### ■ Usage of Direct Allocation Grant

In 2003-2004, a sum of HK\$2.4 million was available for allocation by the RPSC. The Committee was able to support 49 research projects involving about 30% of the academic staff. As in the past, the RPSC allocated 35% of its research budget directly to Academic Programmes as a start-up grant to support projects costing up to HK\$30,000 each without referral to the Committee at the central for approval. The titles and grants for those projects funded from the University's Block Grant and the RGC's Direct Allocation Grant are set out in Reports 2A and 2B respectively. Projects supported from private sources are listed in Report 2C.

### ■ Research Postgraduate Programmes

At present, eight research postgraduate (RPg) programmes are being offered, viz. Chinese, Cultural Studies, English, History, Philosophy, Translation, Business and Social Sciences. The University accepted its first batch of MPhil students in 1995 and launched its PhD

programmes in 2000, taking into account that its staff profile had been strengthened. At present, only 17 RPg places are allocated to Lingnan per year. The number is so small that it makes it difficult to achieve the interaction among postgraduate students, which are essential in providing a meaningful postgraduate education.

Our research postgraduate education received high commendations from both the 2002 UGC Panel on Lingnan and the TLQPR II Panel. The UGC Panel on Lingnan in fact was very supportive of increasing our number of research students “for Lingnan to achieve a sustainable and supportive research environment”. The University eagerly hopes to further develop its research postgraduate education as part of its contribution to the community.

Lingnan has very good reasons to justify such an increase. Firstly, we have relevant staff expertise which is now seriously under-utilized, and their graduate supervising ability is not being used to the full capacity. In terms of the number of staff with supervising capability versus the number of research students, only about one out of every seven to eight faculty members has the opportunity to supervise a postgraduate student. Many well-qualified staff have no students to supervise. More importantly, many students are deprived of the opportunity to benefit from the unique expertise which Lingnan possesses.

Secondly, our research capability has improved significantly. When we first launched our MPhil programmes in 1995, we were only given 5 RPg places. At that time only 29.8% of our academic staff held doctorates, the RAE Research Performance Index (RI) was 12.3%, and there were only 18 candidates applying for admission. Since then, our staff profile and research performance have improved steadily. In 2001 when we were given an RPg number of 17, 83.3% of our academic staff had doctorates, RAE RI rose to 38.85% (1999), and the number of applicants increased to 63. In 2003 and 2004, our PhD staff ratio further increased to 94.0% and 97.5% respectively, and the Internal RAE RI (2003) jumped to 67.9% (see [Figure 1](#) and [Figure 4](#)).

Thirdly, our research postgraduate programmes are closely related to the undergraduate programmes as well as staff’s research areas. Research outcomes, as a recommended source of teaching material in our programmes, are often incorporated into undergraduate courses, making the teaching contents most up to date, interesting and related to real-life.

Fourthly, we have an outstanding track record in research postgraduate education as far as completion rate of our full-time research postgraduate students is concerned. We have achieved an average completion rate of 89.5% since our first cohort, i.e. 8 cohorts admitted in 1995 to 2002. The figure is even more impressive when only the latest two cohorts of full-time MPhil graduates (viz. 2003 and 2004 graduation cohorts) are looked at. All 8 and 7 full-time MPhil students admitted in 2001 and 2002 respectively completed their studies in two years, resulting in a 100% completion rate. Such a high completion rate is to a large extent attributable to our close supervision of our postgraduate students. Also, there has been growing demand for places to pursue MPhil/PhD programmes at Lingnan.

The number of applications for admission in the 2002-03 academic year achieved a record high of 123 (despite the fact that we had little promotion and no “brand name effect”), which almost doubled the figure of the previous year (63 in 2001-02). The number of applications further increased to 138 in 2003-04. The take-up rate has been encouraging – more than 80% in all years.

### ■ The Way Forward

The research capability and the successful research postgraduate education provided by Lingnan is best summed up by the expert members of the UGC Panel on Lingnan: “For a small university, without a tradition of research, evolving the appropriate research strategy can be difficult. Lingnan, by evoking the values of some liberal arts colleges, has articulated a research policy that supports teaching. It encourages the research aspirations of its staff, thereby improving the quality of its recruitment; it is able to support a number of research students who, usefully for themselves and for the University, can engage in teaching. And for a University that is unlikely to achieve the favourable staffing levels of some private US colleges it increases the cadre of high level graduates on the campus.” (Report of the UGC Panel on Lingnan 2003).

The UGC Panel on Lingnan has rightly pointed out that “ The University does have a growing financial crisis and is unlikely to be able to escape from it through its own efforts ... that would probably undo and undermine the excellent progress of recent years.” We believe that an adequately funded research base is essential to our institutional balance and well-being, and is supportive of our teaching endeavours and liberal arts curriculum. As external funding for the kind of non-laboratory based research in the Humanities, Social Sciences and Business, in which we are active, is extremely limited in terms of number and total funds available, we need the UGC/RGC to increase research support in these areas to enable us to build up our research infrastructure.

In this connection, we urge that research performance assessment in future be based on subject disciplines as far as possible. There is much concern over the stringent criteria of measuring research output by publication in top-tier international journals, which in turn has a bearing on the funding allocation. While Lingnan does not object to the stringent scrutiny of research output, it is very important that research output be measured in a more diversified manner instead of using pure top-tier journals. It should be noted that the whole notion of top-tier journals fits in certain areas only, and it is not applicable to humanities and, perhaps to a lesser degree social sciences (H & SS). The criteria for judging research in H & SS areas need to be carefully examined, as they are very different from other disciplines such as science and medicine.

The road map in the higher education sector has recently been set out by the UGC. As role differentiations of UGC-funded institutions differ somewhat, it is inevitable that some “research-intensive” institutions will undertake a higher volume of research. Nevertheless, the proposed migration of research funding to CERG may result in a situation where all

institutions (whether research-oriented or non-research-intensive) would devote their warranted or unwarranted resources and attention exclusively to getting research support through the bidding for CERGs. This will inevitably divert the attention and focus of institutions from teaching to research, thus paying lip-service to the essential role of teaching at universities. This will certainly contravene the role statements of institutions, a situation which we all do not wish to see happening.

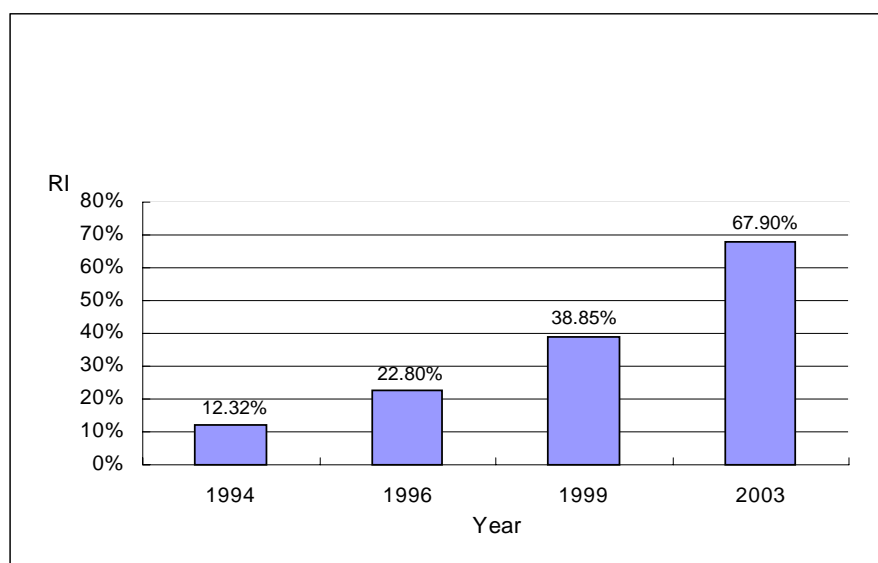

## Appendix 1

### **Priority Research Areas**

In the next triennium, a total of eight priority research areas have been identified for focused support. These are: Cultural Research and Development, Public Humanities, Modern Literature in Chinese, Aesthetics and Theories of the Arts, Taxation, Managerial and Organisational Issues in Chinese Mainland, Social Gerontology and Public Policy. All these research areas are in line with our liberal arts mission, and are selected based on the existing strengths and proven track record, as well as their connectivity to the undergraduate teaching.

#### **Cultural Research and Development**

Culture today is a business of global importance and a focus for policy-makers all over the developed world. The cultural industries such as tourism, cinema, new media, the visual, performing, digital and literary arts, and the heritage industries (cultural tourism, museums, libraries, galleries) are now major forces of both social and economic development, giving rise to an “applied” field of cultural “R&D”. Cultural research helps provide industries (often at the “small business” level) with new ideas and contents they need in order to thrive, while cultural policy aims at fostering both cultural development and community participation.

#### **Public Humanities**

“Public Humanities” is a multi-disciplinary field of teaching and research which investigates the value of the Humanities for the broader cultural, economic and social development of the community. Its object of study is **public culture**, understood as the product of distinctive socio-economic as well as cultural arrangements, traditions and practices; some typical themes for study are “public memory”, “identity” and “community”. Because this field is concerned with the conditions in which shared values are created and debated in particular places, it emphasises modes of teaching and research that foster interaction between the academy, the community and other cultural institutions. It seeks to increase the responsiveness of Humanities research and teaching to other areas of enquiry, exploring the “human implications” and public issues arising from social and economic change and new developments in the sciences and technology, in communications research and environmental studies. It follows that Public Humanities is also concerned with the conditions of knowledge production and dissemination, and with their implications for pedagogy; enquiries into the nature and limits of disciplinarity are central to this field, in which the liberal arts ethos is continuously developed and refined to meet new conditions.

### **Modern Literature in Chinese**

With the recent educational reforms it has been brought to the attention of both educators and the general public that there is a need to reconsider the curricular and methods in the teaching of Chinese literature and writing. The separation between language and literature courses and the separation between literature and student's living experiences have caused the deterioration of students' standard of written Chinese. The present researches on modern literature in Chinese and on creative writing have the aim to change this situation.

### **Aesthetics and Theories of the Arts**

In pursuit of Lingnan's goal to become an internationally recognised liberal arts university, Lingnan is putting forward a proposal for a BA (Hons) programme in the Visual Arts to be launched in the triennium 2005–08. This programme is focused on areas that raise problems of a rhetorical, epistemological, ontological and evaluative nature. It thus offers a rich source for research into such problems, and research into these problems will have direct implications on *how* the major is taught as well as *what* will be taught.

### **Taxation**

Taxation affects the financial decisions of income-earning citizens and profit-making corporations. Therefore, proper handling of taxation matters is of great significance for individuals, corporations, governments and indeed the society as a whole. At Lingnan, we are spearheading academic research efforts in taxation in an attempt to find a better solution of this issue for the local and the international communities.

### **Managerial and Organisational Issues in Chinese Mainland**

A new research area entitled 'Managerial and Organisational Issues in Chinese Mainland' that provides a China focus for research into a variety of issues many of which are cross disciplinary in nature is proposed. The area encompasses a cluster of research interests and studies that currently engages academic staff in the Business Programme including conflict and cooperation, corporate governance and ethics, leadership, risk management, cross cultural factors, marketing and organisational learning, China business, merchandising, consumer behaviour, logistics and supply, customer relationship management, the application and adoption of e-business, data base and knowledge management, and systems/software development etc.

### **Social Gerontology**

Social gerontology is a well-established inter-disciplinary teaching and research area that studies both the outcomes and processes of ageing, often adopting a life span perspective. It looks at the social consequences of ageing in individuals, groups (such as the family) and society and can propose potential solutions for some of the challenges facing rapidly ageing population all over the world. The subject is gaining increasing importance as the world community begins to discover that a different mind set towards ageing is required to turn the social disadvantages of ageing into opportunities (e.g. taking retired persons as a huge social capital). The Department of Politics and Sociology has recognised reputation in this area.

### **Public Policy**

It has been pointed out, both in the Sutherland Report and in Mr. Tung Chee-hwa's 2004 Policy Address, that there is a great need for public policy research. Indeed, quality public policy research is the basis for quality public policy, and quality public policy helps build a sound economy, harmonious society, and a healthy environment. Lingnan University is blessed with having a very strong team of public policy analysts who are well trained in their respective disciplines and even several disciplines, who are highly versatile both in theoretical and empirical skills, and who are deeply interested in promoting the long term interest of Hong Kong. We have a fantastic public policy programme and are uniquely positioned to serve as a think-tank for the government and for the public at large.

- 45 *Translation of other's work* – Translation of an item of type (11) through (22) and (41) above, written by others: translation of one's own work is considered part of the authoring process and should not be included
- 46 *Engineering, architectural, graphic designs* – An engineering, architectural, graphic, landscape, or interior design (or the equivalent), whether prepared for a client or in the public domain
- 47 *Computer software or system* – Development of a shareable computer software program, computer language, expert system, computer-aided instruction package or the equivalent
- 48 *Consulting or contract research report* – Report on work performed under an institutional consulting or research contract: reports counted here generally will be prepared for the client, and they may be proprietary if institutional rules permit
- 49 *Written teaching case study or extensive note* – Material prepared for teaching purposes with applicability beyond one's own course needs; short notes and descriptions prepared for immediate class use should not be included

## **5 *Patents, agreements, assignments and companies***

- 51 *Patents issued* – patents on work done at the reporting institution issued within the specified reporting period; not patents filed, not patents held in previous years, and not patents obtained/held on work done elsewhere
- 52 *Licensing agreements* – the licensing of technology/invention **from** the reporting institution within the specified reporting period
- 53 *Assignments of intellectual property rights* – the assignment based on technology/invention **from** the reporting institution within the specified reporting period
- 54 *Companies* – registered companies in which the institution holds an equity by virtue of technology transfer, where the acquisition of such equity (including any increase in equity) by technology transfer occurred during the specified reporting period

## **6 *All other outputs***

- 61 *Journal editor* – Editor, associate editor, or the equivalent of a journal or similar on-going publication venture ('editorial membership' should be excluded)
- 62 *Review of books or of software* – Published or widely-disseminated reviews of books, other publications, software or similar items: dissemination must extend beyond the institution and its research sponsors [reviews for institutional clients should be counted under (49)]
- 63 *Postgraduate research theses* – MPhil or PhD theses of research students who defended successfully within the specified reporting period
- 64 *Other outputs* – Any substantive output of original research not listed above

## **Notes**

- 1. Publications are listed by cost centres. For each publication, the name(s) of the author(s) belonging to the corresponding cost centre (during the reporting period) is/are underlined. In the case of students, a "#" is placed against their names.
- 2. The fraction appearing in the "Weighting" column of those co-authored items denotes the weighting of the authors concerned, calculated on a pro-rata basis. For example, a paper with four authors will count as 0.25 for each author, and if three of the four authors are staff members in the same cost centre, the paper will count as  $3 \times 0.25 = 0.75$  in the cost-centre total.
