

Bloom's Taxonomy

Bloom, B.S., ed. 1972 c1956-64. *Taxonomy* of educational objectives; the classification of educational goals, New York, D. McKay Co

Taxonomy; (tax·on·o·my)

Pronunciation: \tak-'sä-nə-mē\

Definitions:

- ► The science of systematic classification
- ► The act of distributing things into classes or categories of the same type


Reciprocity; (rec·i·proc·i·ty)

Pronunciation: \re-sə-'prä-s(ə-)tē\

Definitions:

- ► A relation of mutual dependence or action or influence
- Mutual interactions, the act of reciprocating or exchanging (especially information)



Entry Level Questions

- Identify & discuss some opportunities to partner w/ organizations to provide service-learning at the 'Remembering' and/or ' Understanding ' levels. What might they look like?
- What are the benefits for each partner? What do they bring to the partnership?

Mid Level Questions

How would you partner w/ an organization to provide service-learning at the Application &/or Analysis level? Map the process you would use to create such a partnership and the resources needed to maintain it.

Mastery Level Questions

- Why would your partner w/ an organization to provide service-learning at the 'Synthesis' &/or 'Evaluation' levels? How would you judge the partnership from a cost/benefit point of view?
- Play devil's advocate & look for possible pitfalls & discuss how you might mitigate such problems.
