Why Service-Learning?

1. **It is an effective pedagogy and brings students to learn from doing in a real social setting.**
2. **It enables the university to achieve the mission of a Catholic University revealed in *Ex Corde Ecclesiae*.**
3. **It helps the Fu Jen to establish a distinctive characteristics as a Catholic University.**

Historical Review—I

- Sept. 1998 Started trial sessions of S-L units for Philosophy of Life
College of Management
- Feb. 1999 Started experience units for S-L for Philosophy of Life
Colleges of Management and Law
- Aug. 1999 Started experience units for S-L for Philosophy of Life
University-wide
A staff member recruited for the purpose
- Sept. 1999 Experimented on Professional S-L Curriculum
Department of Business Administration



Historical Review—II

- Aug. 2000 Awarded a three-year Research Grant by National Science Council for “Integration of Knowledge Management and Profession Training” to promote S-L Curriculum
- Sept. 2001 Awarded a four-year Grant by Ministry of Education for “Integration of Humanities Education and Professional Curriculum”
Started exploring and implementing S-L curriculum for Philosophy of Life and professional courses
- Feb. 2002 Started experiments on Group Service-Learning for Professional Courses in 7 departments (Physical Education and Public Health, etc)



Historical Review—III

- Oct. 2002 Started comprehensive plans for implementing Commonly-concerned issues and Community Service S-L
- Aug. 2004 Formed the Service-Learning Curriculum Committee, a University Level Committee to promote S-L
- Sept. 2005 Awarded the four-year Teaching Excellence Grant funded by the Ministry of Education and started the Ploughman's S-L Project, to further promote service-learning by building national and international links

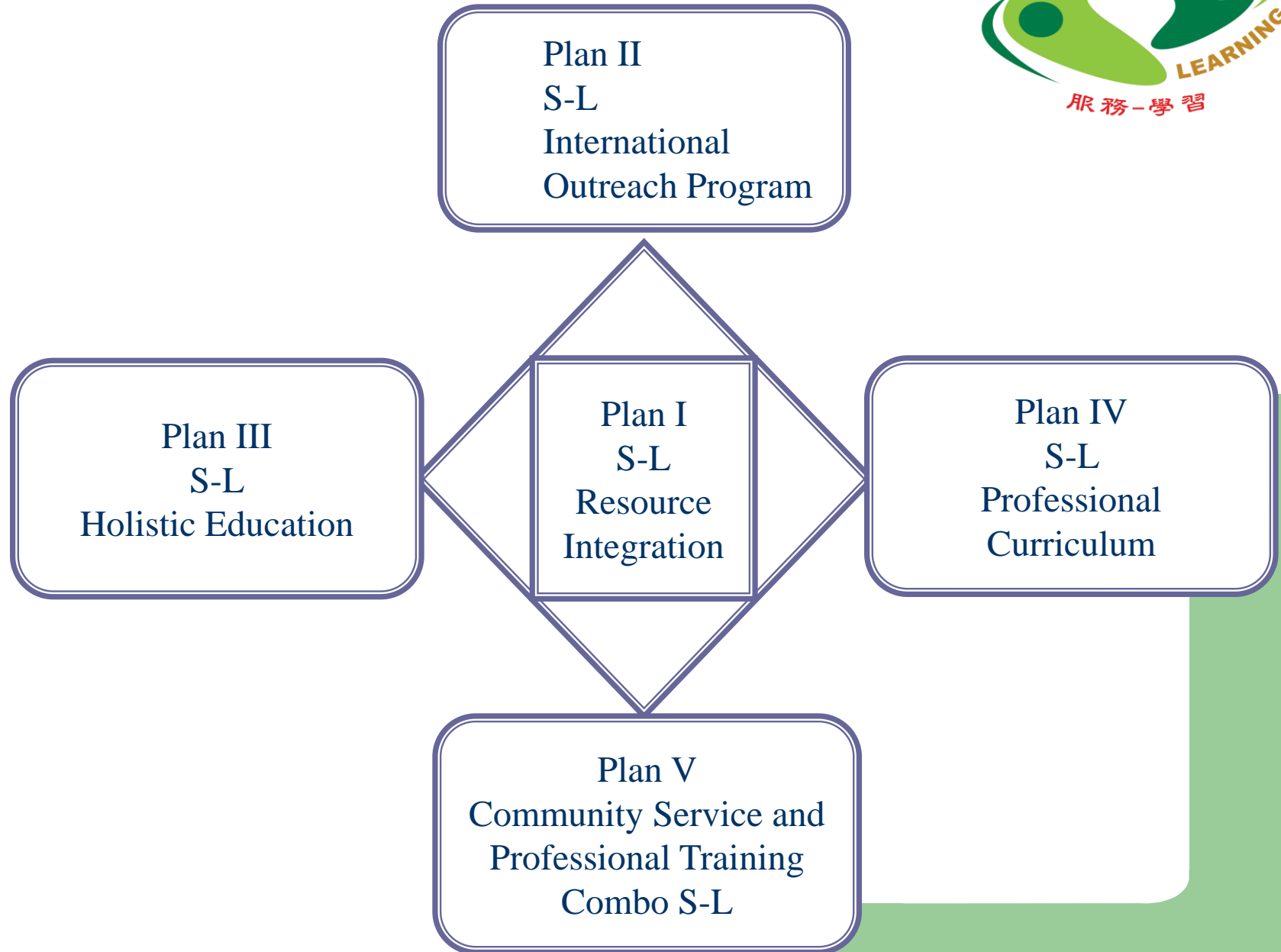

Important Steps for Service-Learning

1. Preparation: including both the administrative and academic planning for the content of the course and service
2. Service: the actual field work of providing service
3. Reflection: the key to Service-learning in that it gives students an opportunity to share and reflect on what they see, hear, and observe. With reflective writing, students can have an opportunity to evaluate and improve the service provided.
4. Celebration: an opportunity to recognize and encourage the overall work but more importantly an occasion for all participants to get together and share experiences.
