

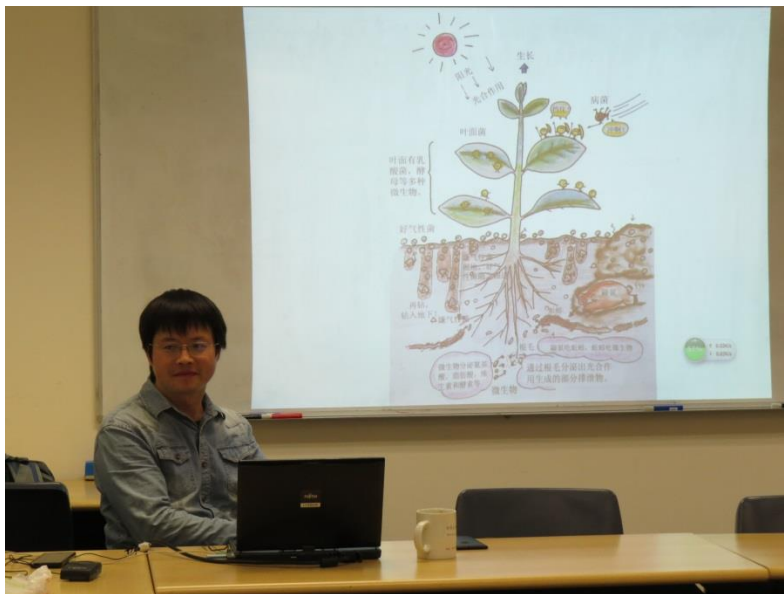
## Lingnan Gardeners Newsletter No.2

### **Lingnan goes back to its roots**

Lingnan University has launched the Lingnan Gardeners project (left), organised under the culture and sustainable livelihood research cluster of its Kwan Fong cultural research and development programme, to pull together efforts of staff, students and alumni to become pioneers in developing a “transition campus” in Hong Kong.

The idea of “transition campus” is derived from the concept of “transition towns” in some countries which see the renurturing of soil and roots above cemented land. The Lingnan Gardeners project promotes organic farming and related research studies. Certain areas in between academic buildings have been allocated for the farming of crops.
