



嶺南大學（廣州校址）

**嶺南學院**於一九六七年在香港創辦，旨在繼承及發揚前廣州嶺南大學的傳統，其歷史淵源可追溯至一八八八年。建校以來，穩步邁進，一九九一年從一所專上學院晉身為「大學教育資助委員會」資助體系內七所頒授學位的大專院校之一。

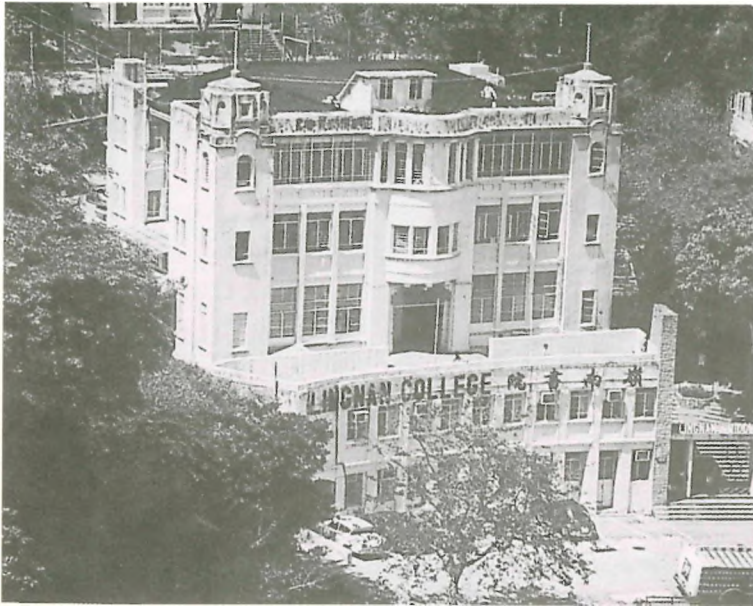
學院現致力在不久將來獲致自我評審資格及正名為香港的第七所大學，並發展為一所國際認可的人文科學大學，課程既重視專業科目，同時又注重通識教育，使成為文、商及社會科學三學院所提供課程的核心部分。學院目前開辦「中文」、「翻譯」、「工商管理」及「社會科學」榮譽學士課程。此外，學院設立通識教育學部，協助學生擴闊知識和概念視野，及強化他們對道德與人道責任的瞭解和承擔。

學院設有六所研究中心：「亞洲太平洋研究中心」、「企業管理研究中心」、「國際企業研究中心」、「文學、語言及翻譯研究中心」、「現代中文文學研究中心」及「公共政策研究中心」。六所研究中心專責個別範疇內的研究，同時與本地、鄰近地區及海外院校加強聯繫，推廣學術活動與交流。

自一九九五至九六學年開始，學院設辦「翻譯」及「社會科學」兩項哲學碩士課程，並計劃將碩士課程擴展至「商學」、「中文」及「人文學科」領域，其後更進而提供「商學」、「中文」、「社會科學」及「翻譯」博士學位課程。學院現有二千五十多名學生，一九九七至九八學年將增至二千一百人。

**LINGNAN COLLEGE** was founded in Hong Kong in 1967 to carry on the traditions of the former Lingnan University in Canton, China, the forerunner of which dates back to 1888. It has progressed from being a post secondary college to one of the seven degree-conferring tertiary institutions funded by the University Grants Committee of Hong Kong since 1991.

The College is seeking to achieve, in the immediate future, self accreditation status and designation as Hong Kong's seventh University. It plans to develop as an internationally recognised Liberal Arts University with a balance in its curriculum between professional subjects and general education which will provide the core of the courses offered by its three Faculties - Arts, Business and Social Sciences. These Faculties currently offer Honours Bachelor Degrees in Chinese, Translation, Business Administration and Social Sciences, within which the General Education Division

offers courses which aim to broaden the perceptual horizons of the students, and to develop an understanding of, and a commitment to, their moral and humanitarian responsibilities.

The College has established six research centres - Asian Pacific Studies; Entrepreneurial Studies; International Business Studies; Literature, Language and Translation; Modern Literature in Chinese; and Public Policy Studies - so as to focus on research in their respective areas as well as to foster links with local, regional and overseas institutions for academic exchanges and activities.

Since the 1995-96 academic year, the College has started offering research degree programmes at master's level in Translation and Social Sciences. It is planned to expand these programmes to the discipline areas of Business, Chinese, Humanities and subsequently to offer doctoral programmes in Business, Chinese, Social Sciences and Translation. Student numbers are expected to grow from the present of 2050 to 2100 by 1997-98.
